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Federal Election 2013

On Saturday 7 September Australians went to the polls. We now have a new Federal Government in the LNP and Prime Minister Tony Abbott.

On Monday 16 September Mr Abbott announced his 30-strong cabinet and outer ministry. Senator Mitch Fifield was appointed Assistant Minister for Social Services (Kevin Andrews was appointed Minister for Social Services) which will include responsibility for disability reform.

Since the announcement, disability advocates, social commentators and members of the opposition have voiced their concern that there is no longer an individual portfolio for disability.

Former Minister for Disability reform Jenny Macklin commented in *The Australian* (Jenny Macklin laments loss of focus on DisabilityCare, Wednesday 18 September 2013) "It is deeply worrying that the biggest social reform in a generation is not a high enough priority for the new government to warrant the attention of a cabinet minister".

Editor of the ABC's Ramp Up, Stella Young, commented in the same article that while Senator Mitch Fifield was a good choice given his prior involvement in the development of the NDIS, "I wish the role itself was considered important enough to be inside the cabinet room".

At JFA Purple Orange we are less concerned about ministry title and more concerned about how the person will provide effective leadership to help ensure the new disability policy and funding arrangements genuinely achieve a paradigm shift in how people are supported. In other words, it's about the results.

Outside Cabinet, we assume Senator Fifield will actively uphold the new government's policy commitment to the disability community, while inside Cabinet we assume Minister Andrews will carry accountability for the reform, which we hope and trust includes accountability for ensuring disability reform remains prominent on Cabinet's agenda. In other words, it's about the influence.

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Practical Design Fund Reports

Earlier this year JFA Purple Orange undertook two projects as part of the Commonwealth Government's Practical Design Fund in preparation for the National Disability Insurance Scheme, DisabilityCare Australia.

We are very pleased with the results from both projects. The first project used a co-design methodology, supplemented by an extensive consultation at various centres around Australia, to identify what people would want from a disability funding online marketplace, which we called an 'eMarket', similar to eBay, Gumtree and TripAdvisor.

There was strong support for an eMarket and our report highlighted what people wanted from an eMarket, together with our recommendations about how it might be commissioned and operated.

The second project looked at the exercise of values-based leadership in disability service agencies. We ran a series of two-day workshops, in the five NDIS launch sites, to more than 150 leaders from disability agencies, assisting them to explore the values that might help ensure agencies can be genuinely helpful to the life chances of people living with disability and their families.

The workshops were run in conjunction with the South Australian Council of Social Services (SACOSS).

The workshops were well-received and our report included recommendations for how to maintain the momentum of values-based conversations in service agencies.
